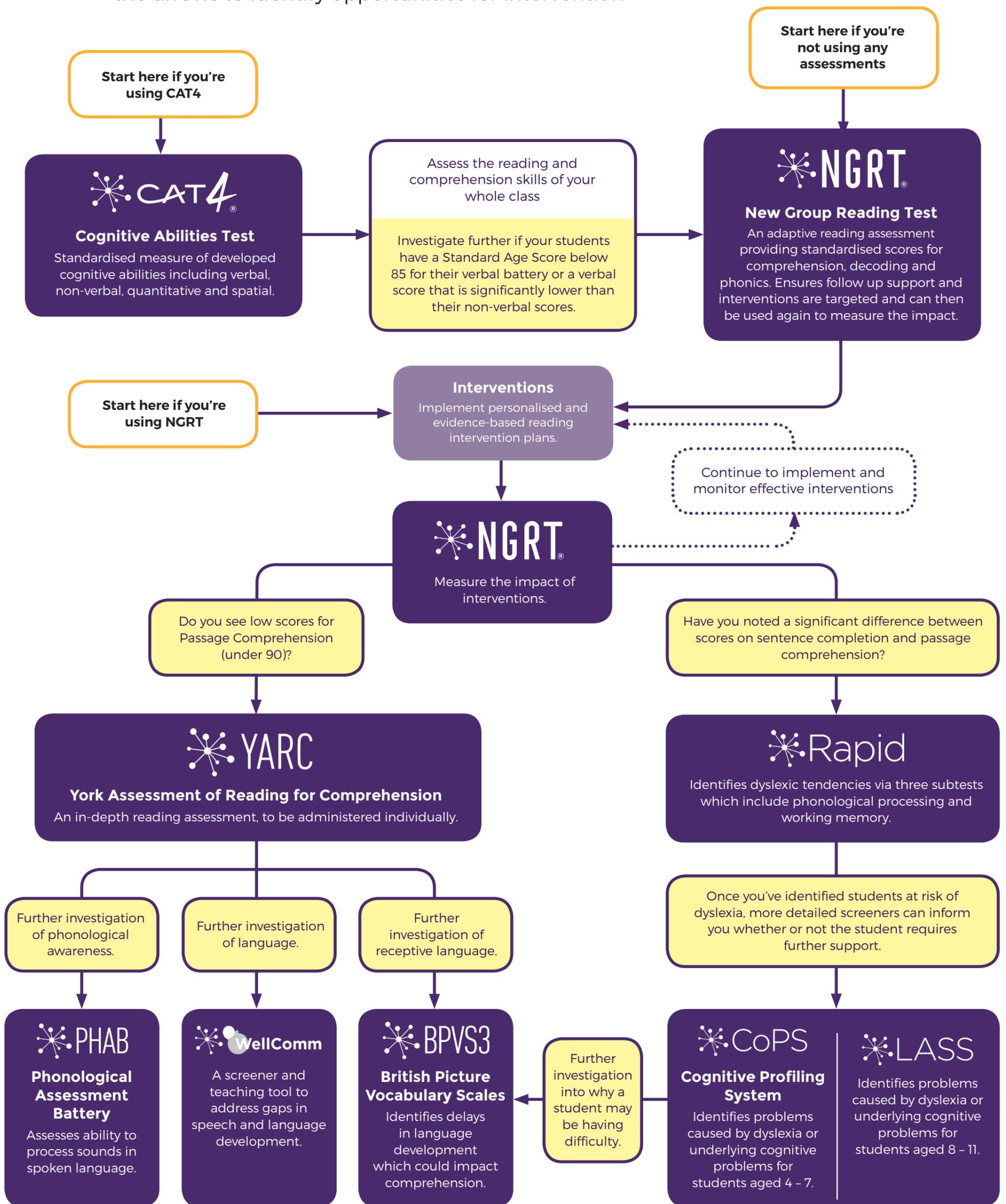


Reading Assessment Flowchart

 <p>NGRT New Group Reading Test</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> NGRT is a whole group test which assesses students' reading and comprehension skills It produces a student's Standard Age score and reading age The digital version is adaptive, allowing the accurate assessment of all abilities 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It identifies students who may need further support Provides benchmarking Helps identify EAL students with weak comprehension skills Enables you to support personalised learning and target setting 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Digital - adaptive Paper 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 5 - 16 digital 7 - 16 paper 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> YARC: If a student's SAS is <85, you may have concerns about their comprehension Rapid: If there is a significant difference between the sentence completion and passage comprehension scores, students could be at risk of dyslexia

 <p>BPVS3 British Picture Vocabulary Scale</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A standardised tool to identify if there are any delays in language development which could be impacting upon comprehension Designed to work with pupils with autism and related communication difficulties, as well as EAL students Provides a standardised age score, percentile rank and age equivalent score 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Assesses a child's receptive vocabulary and language development in non-readers BPVS acts as an indicator of future attainment Screen EAL students to ensure they have the required level of English to access the curriculum 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Paper 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 3 - 16 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In-class interventions
 <p>CoPS</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CoPS is a dyslexia screener which pinpoints specific areas of difficulty and gives a detailed indicator of an individual pupil's strengths and weaknesses 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CoPS identifies specific areas of need and helps you to find a more detailed indication of a pupil's particular strengths and weaknesses The reports give you percentiles, standardised age scores and age equivalent scores An overall Dyslexia Index letter code can be identified 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Digital 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 4 - 7 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Consult an Educational psychologist
 <p>LASS</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> LASS is a multifunctional assessment system designed to highlight differences between actual and expected literacy levels 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> LASS can be used to measure ongoing progress in reading and spelling on a regular basis, or to consider a pupil's dyslexic profile in greater depth An overall Dyslexia Index letter code can be identified 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Digital 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 8 - 15 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Consult an Educational psychologist
